

More than 150 health and safety representatives and leaders gathered at Unifor's Family Education Centre in Port Elgin, Ont., for the 2022 Health and Safety Conference.

Wage increases continue to gather momentum, with another 1.1% increase in average hourly wages in September. Real wages (adjusted for inflation) are now down 1.5% since last September, which is the smallest year-over-year gap since February of this year, according to September's Labour Market Insights.
