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IN THE NEWS



Members at Ford have ratified a pattern setting agreement that delivers significant wage increases, bonuses, pension improvements, product plans and a path to full employment at Oakville Assembly.

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The U.S. move to implement a 50% tariff on additional Canadian products is designed to inflict economic pain, squeeze concessions, and divide Canada.

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Unifor members rallied to urge government to stop two-tiered healthcare and invest in public healthcare.

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Unifor condemns dozens of job cuts at Corus Entertainment, the latest sign of a broadcasting sector under mounting pressure from media consolidation, delayed government action, and financial uncertainty.
